- Founded in Hamilton 138 years ago
- The "dinghy" in the name is not any old small sailboat; it refers to the Bermuda Fitted Dinghy
- Our fitted dinghy is Elizabeth II (more about her later)
- The only Royal dinghy club in the world!
- Royal warrant was granted by Princess Louise in 1883
- One of the few clubs permitted to fly the white ensign
- Moved from Hamilton to Mangroville in 1964

#### Governance

The Committee of Management has responsibility for overall management of the Club

The Membership Committee has responsibility for the election and removal of members

It is also charged with ensuring there is a succession plan in place for the Club Officers

**The Finance Committee** has responsibility for overseeing the financial affairs of the Club




■ The Rules Committee is responsible for a regular review of the rules of the Club to ensure they are up-to-date and appropriate — not to be confused with "house rules"!

- Accredited US Sailing Association training centre
- Sailing Director & Sailing Coach: Nico & Maria
- The Dock Committee is responsible for the management of the Dock & Marina
- The Marina is one of the main revenue streams for the Club

# The Fitted Dinghy

\* well, it did until the Govt messed with 24th May holiday.....

- In the late 1700s ordinary Bermuda fishing dinghies and workboats were "fitted" with sails, keel and ballast
- 14ft long
- Over 800 sq ft of sail
- Crew of 6
- Spars are spruce
- Sadly, only 4 clubs now race these dinghies
- 10 races per year
- Season starts on 24th May\* in St. George's and ends the weekend before Labor Day
- Elizabeth was launched in 1953 to commemorate the Coronation & named after HM
- She was designed and built by Bert Darrell









Built in 1991

Cost: \$98,738.76

Annual budget: \$30,000 excl sails, maintenance & (importantly) food for volunteers on race days

- Volunteer crew and race committee always welcomed
- She lives in the shed next to the Jr Sailing shed – go check her out one day!





### Junior Sailing

- The junior sailing programme is divided into 4 terms:
- Winter (January-February-March)
- Spring (April-May-June)
- Summer (July-August summer camp)
- Fall (September-December)

There are also private lessons year round

Open bics (from 12 years old)
420 (from 14 years old)
Laser (from 14 years old)
29er (from 14 years old)
505 (from 16 years old)
Nacra 15 (from 16 years old)





### Adult Sailing

Adult courses are blocks of 4 lessons

Sailing classes are 2&1/2 hours

Powerboat lessons are 2 hours

Private lessons both for sailing & powerboat are offered

- Sailing is on 420 (dinghy) or J24 (keelboat)
- Powerboat courses are on RIBs
- US Sailing instructor qualifications (this is 24 hours & only on J24s)

Fleet of RS21 keelboats arriving 1Q21 – for charter & international events/regattas






## About the Marina

- 50/30 amp Power and water at each berth
- Fingers and hold-offs to accommodate yachts on West Breakwater
- Hurricane Class Marina\*

- Pre-bagged ice
- Crane with 2 ton capacity
- Ramp for launching
- Overnight dockage
- Concierge service for food and drink
- Fresh filtered cold drinking water
- Boat sewage waste removal

## Around the Clubhouse

- Upstairs, there a number of rooms available for meetings or private dinners & lunches (or when parties are allowed again)
- The Top of The Harbour Dining Room has the same views as the lower bar and patio – but with air conditioning. There is also an upper bar for drinks (the "wake room")
- Restroom facilities upstairs are (very) limited (1 only)
- There is an elevator
- Boathouse roof is a spectacular place for a private party
- The South Lawn is the perfect wedding spot









(What's Happening or Watch this Space!)

- In the summer months to take out Knot Mine book early to avoid disappointment!
- The snooker room has been repurposed into a teen lounge
- Soon there will be a climbing frame/swings for younger children
- The old tennis court will have dry storage racks for boats – ramp is currently under construction
- There is a plan to renovate the main bar
- Outdoor tents now provide some shade on the Boathouse roof – but there is a plan for a more permanent covering
