History

The Radcliffe Pitches, Harvard's oldest treble-voiced a cappella group, was founded in 1975 at the historic Hasty Pudding Club. Founders Dianne Nabatoff '78 and Kathy Manning '78 were undergraduates at Radcliffe College when they created the Pitches as a group for female voices to sing in a close harmony setting. Today, the group is composed of 14 Harvard undergraduates who perform a repertoire inspired by artists such as The Andrews Sisters, Ella Fitzgerald, and Frank Sinatra.

The Pitches perform regularly on the Harvard campus, singing two concerts each year at Sanders Theatre. The group also performs on various tours within the United States and to international destinations including Thailand, China, Japan, South Korea, England, France, Germany, and Hong Kong. Other notable performances include appearances at the 1993 inauguration celebrations for President William Clinton and the Hasty Pudding Man of the Year awards, whose past recipients include Ryan Reynolds, Ben Platt, Neil Patrick Harris, Jason Segel, Justin Timberlake, and Ben Stiller.

Musical Style

The Pitches perform a large and varied repertoire of jazz standards, swing and boogie-woogie, and contemporary pieces, drawing upon the musical stylings of inspirational figures such as Peggy Lee, Louis Armstrong, and Stevie Wonder. Our arrangements showcase close harmonies, swing rhythms, the solo jazz voice, trios and scats, as well as choreography. Our repertoire also covers a large emotional range, from heartfelt ballads to cheerful toe-tapping tunes – whatever the occasion, we've got a song or two for you!
